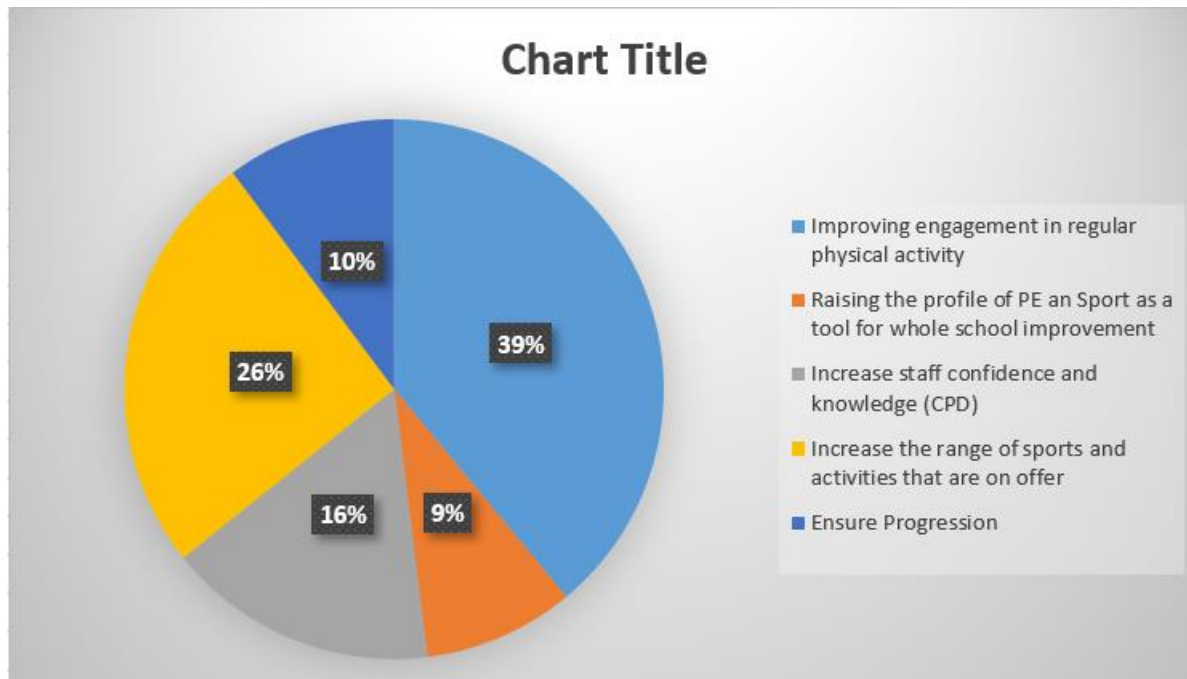


PE Sports Premium Funding Expenditure Percentage Breakdown 2022 – 2023

Over the course of the academic year 2022-2023, Corsham Primary school received £21,800 as part of a government funded initiative - the PE and sports premium. The funding is as a result of the 2012 London Olympics and part of the Olympic legacy. The aim of the initiative is to improve the quality, variety and general provision of PE at primary schools.

The graph below shows a percentage breakdown of how Corsham Primary School used the funding to improve the quality, variety and provision over the academic year 2021 -2022

Staff Training CPD

All teaching staff at Corsham Primary School answered a questionnaire in order to identify teaching strengths and weaknesses. Twelve teaching staff received coaching and mentoring from an outside agency of fully qualified teachers and sports coaches, on a given unit suitable for their year for a six week period on a scheme called Real PE or more traditional sports using The PE Hub schemes of work. These lessons were observed regularly in order to monitor their impact and ensure their quality.

Resources and Equipment

Corsham Primary used part of the funding to replace and improve the resource available to improve the provision of PE. With the curriculum slightly changing we needed to provide new equipment for some sports for example badminton, new nets, rackets and shuttlecocks.

Increasing Participation, Variety and the amount of Competitive Sports

The employment of the SSCO allowed the children to attend sporting events that were competitive and non-competitive. These were mainly focusing on year 5 and 6 and many children represented the school in a range of sports. We represented the local schools at the Girls North Wiltshire Football finals where we came third. We manage some Intrasport competitions between year groups, which

was a huge success. Sports days went ahead at both sites and events where every child the opportunity to participate.

Bath Rugby Foundation came in to work with Year 5 and 6 with their leadership package. We also had Bath Rugby Foundation leading Attacking Maths with year 4 at the Pound Pill site. Wiltshire cricket provided some sessions for some different year groups linking to their unit of work.

We also provided the opportunity for those children that could not swim 25 metres in year 5 and 6 with booster sessions. This was a huge success, currently year 3 and 4 have lessons as part of the PE curriculum.

Monitoring Impact & Stationery and Materials

Money was also spent on monitoring the impact of the expenditure and on stationery and materials to aid the delivery of PE, as well as release time for Lead Athletes to create progression documents and review the curriculum.
